EPIPHANY: The Season of Light Written by Pastor Handstedt

Years ago, my wife Sherrill and I took a memorable walk in the dark. We were at the cottage and had visited friends for supper. Suddenly dusk was upon us. "We'll give you a ride back to your cottage," they offered. "Oh, we'll be fine, I responded. It's only a ten-minute walk." And so we started out, down their driveway to the gravel road that connected our cottages. It was a cloudy night. No stars, light at first, then almost total darkness. And so it was that a ten-minute walk stretched toward an hour, all the while featuring a husband and wife, now holding hands, almost stumbling in the darkness, and scraping shoes against the surface to make sure they were still on the road. Finally, a faint beam from our cottages floodlight appeared. We carefully let the light guide us home.

We live in the northern hemisphere and these months light is treasured, for darkness reigns. The lights of outside Christmas decorations have been removed. Many of us venture outside less, which can aid a depressive mood. Oh yes, and then there's the internal darkness brought on by the ever-present threat of Covid with its emerging variants. And did I mention the political divide which seems to permeate every new issue? Darkness seems to reign.

BUT A LIGHT INVADES this darkness---and severely diminishes it. Gospel writers put it this way:

"The people wo sat in darkness have seen a great light, and for those who sat in the region and shadow of death light has dawned." (Mt. 4:15) John's gospel, speaking of Jesus, is even clearer:

"What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it." (John 1:5)

As a counter to our present darkness, we are now placed in the season of <u>Epiphany</u>, the season of light. The various assigned gospel readings lift up Jesus as the true light of the world. They speak of Wise Men who follow the star and are brought to Jesus. The message: Outsiders are included. The Light of Jesus is for all people.

Then there's the wedding in Cana of Galilee where wine, a symbol of joy, is depleted. But Jesus, by his presence, brings new and finer wine---the greatest of joy---so that the celebration of life continues. Guided by Jesus, people now walk in light, no longer stumbling in darkness

The season of Epiphany includes assigned gospel readings that reverse how we presently see things. Light and joy are found in caring for the poor and for captives, not in the accumulation of wealth (Luke 4:18ff and 6:20ff). Epiphany season end with the gospel narrative describing the Mount of Transfiguration where the voice of God says of Jesus: "This is my Son, the Beloved; listen to him!"

In our memorable walk in the dark the light from our cottage seemed weak, almost non-existent, at first. But as we moved toward it the way became more and more clear. That's the hope and purpose of Epiphany, that the Light who is Jesus will draw us closer to Him and that His love will be reflected through us to others.
